

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MSc Advanced Social Work Practice Entry Requirements

The normal entry requirements for the programme are:

Entry to the Programme is normally at BSc level. You should have an honours degree in Social Work or have relevant qualifications.

You will normally have some relevant social work/health practice experience after qualification

You will be registered with Social Work England/The appropriate body.

The expectation is that you will be employed in a social work setting prior to applying for the Programme.
